St. Luke's United Methodist Church

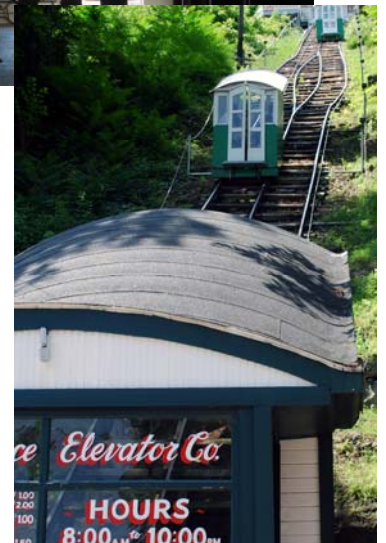
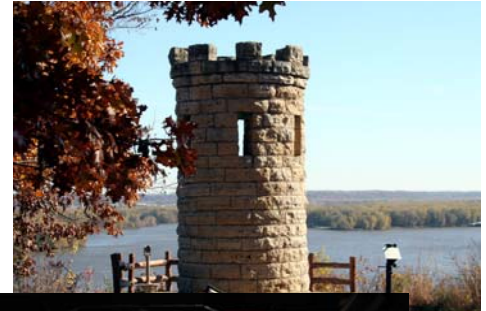
Over 100 Tiffany Stained Glass Windows outline one of the oldest Methodist Church's in Iowa
